*BAPTISMAL REMEMBRANCE

We have received our † baptism through hearing the Word proclaimed to us. By God's grace, we may also proclaim Christ crucified and risen. God's grace has not been in vain. So we proclaim and so we believe. (*adapted, 1 Corinthians 15:10-11*)

If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation is in vain and our faith is in vain. (14)

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human. For as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. (20-22)

The last enemy to be destroyed is death. (26)

Do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we were buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life. (*Romans 6:3-4*)

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. (5)

But if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him.

We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. (8-9)

The death he died, he died to sin once for all, but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

FIRST READING

1 Peter 3:13-22

Faith comes from what is heard,

and what is heard comes through the Word of Christ. (*Romans 10:17*)

Hear what the Spirit is saying. **Our ears and hearts are open.**

Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and respect. Maintain a good conscience so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight lives, were saved through water. *And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.*
