From the Pastor...







We're in phase three! We're in phase three! People are getting vaccinated! The numbers are going down! We're on the path to normal! And even more, ... It's EASTER!

Sweet Jesus, it seems like we too might be actually rising from the grave. The flowers are up, and the daffodils seem brighter this year. My yard is full of witch hazel and green sprouts and mud. The children are starting back to school, musicians are planning concerts. We might be able to go to a sporting event! We might be able to worship together. As a matter of fact, we will worship together in person Easter Sunday at Carkeek Park at 6:30am.

One of the deepest theological underpinnings of Christianity in general and Lutheranism in particular is the cycle of dying and rising, of ending and beginning. In the small catechism, Luther writes that through our baptism, "The old Adam [human] in us should... be drowned and die... and that a new person should daily come forth and rise." His inspiration comes from Romans 6, where Paul writes that "We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. "(Romans 6:4)

I love that this concept can give us hope throughout our lives. With every "small" death we suffer – loss of job or career, illness, loss of a loved one, while not completely ending our lives, brings us misery and chaos. However, we can remember that God brings new life out of every death. When we are in the grave, when we are buried in grief or depression, it can be hard to imagine what good could possibly come, but our God is a God of new life and resurrection, and I do know that new life does always come.

Shelbe Kukowski, our council president, and I, have put together a strong transition team to talk about what our new life following COVID might be like. This resurrection will be slow, intentional, and wellthought out. We have invited health care professionals, event planners, lawyers, and organizers from within our congregation to help us make sense of our situation. We have a complex path forward between state requirements, county requirements, synod requirements, and our own construction timeline and path. We have to consider things like: will we be inside or outside? Will we sing or not? Will we have communion? How do we maintain our online presence for those who need to worship from home? What can our staff handle, and what do we need volunteers to do?

My dear friends in Christ, we will be together soon, and God is faithful in all this.

I am so grateful for our continued worship life together through this period of separation, and I yearn so much for us to be together and pass the peace. I pray for your continued patience as more and more of us are vaccinated, and the curve toward normal keeps bending homeward.

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked...


John 20:1

What Happened Last Month: Renovation Update



March 3, 2021 – The structural steel column work for seismic improvements is complete. The last four columns were installed adjacent to and between the tall stained-glass windows on the east end of the Sanctuary. While the process was a little slower than anticipated, everything fit, is secure, inspected, and approved.

Mechanical, electrical, and plumbing rough-in is nearly complete with final inspections planned over the next week. This is called a "cover inspection" and is required prior to closing walls. Once approved, these framed walls can be insulated, drywall will be installed, and the finishes (paint, ceiling, flooring) can begin. LZL Construction, the general contractor for the project is working the building in three zones: The lower level,

administration, and the sanctuary. The Narthex falls between and will be worked primarily with the Sanctuary since it provides access to the full main floor of the Church.

LZL laid out all salvaged pew material so it could be inspected, measured, and cataloged. While the pews looked similar, there are subtle but important difference in how they were constructed and how the wood can be reused. For example, some of the seats were contoured and some were flat. The contoured seats are veneer glued to a pine core and they have to be cut and prepared differently than the larger flat pieces of solid oak.

After cutting, planing, sanding, and sealing, the wood from these pews will be re-purposed for use in the sanctuary; it will flank the Chancel on each side, extending into the Chapel and it will clad the south wall and extend north into the small meeting room. There are various other areas in the space that will use the wood seats/backs, the pew ends, and the hymnal holders that were located on the back of each pew.

March 17, 2021 - LZL continues to make measurable progress. Insulation of exterior walls, ceilings, and partition walls is complete at the lower level, administration, and Narthex. Drywall was stocked on site this week and inspections for cover are complete. Drywall installation and joint prep will occur over the next two weeks throughout the building. This is milestone for the project and allows finish work like paint, wood trim, and cabinets too move forward.

The next significant milestone for the project will be the removal of the library (and stair) portion of the building. LZL has been working to separate the structure from the main building to facilitate the demolition and required structure reconfiguration for the roof line. As you can see in the photo above, the entry roof has been re-framed and new beam extended out to carry the roof load. Full



removal of the structure is planned for mid-April and will include the lower-level basement room. The new foundation walls and water proofing is in place to allow backfill of the area immediately following removal.

Changes affecting the Project Cost Contingency:

- redit of \$400 for changing lower-level storefront and door to aluminum and adding electric strike.
- Revise Chapel north wall design.
- Raise hydronic pipes in basement to eliminate damage potential.
- Wire replacement to meeting current codes and ensure warranties on new equipment.
- Electrical conduit and added outlets to support A/V systems and use in the building.
- Glaze two windows with opaque glass at lower level adjacent to new entry door.
- Reconcile bid allowance for improvements in Sacristy (credit).
- Delete acoustical panels in Fellowship Hall (credit).
- Reconcile bid allowance for drinking fountains (credit).
- Lighting fixtures change due to ceiling configurations and availability of fixtures.
- Added cabinets and built ins for reception and office 119 (in lieu of furniture).
- Credit for permitting fees not used in LZL's contract.
