From the Pastor...

Listen, I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but we will all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed.

1 Corinthians 15:51-52

This Lent, we have been looking at what it means to be created for community, and as we move into Easter and Holy Week, the miracle of new life is springing up around us everywhere we look. Looking with hope toward Easter is the most natural thing we can do as Christians. Even as the earth is filled with signs of death and destruction – at this writing the bombs are falling in Ukraine, anti-transgender legislation is being presented in state governments around the country, climate change is rearing its inevitable head, and the list goes on. Even amid all this, we are people of hope. Martin Luther once wrote:

“Even if I knew that tomorrow the world would go to pieces, I would still plant my apple tree.”

As we move through the world, it is imperative that we watch for the rings, the circles, the signs of death moving toward new life. The cycle of death, mourning, burial, and then new life is built into every aspect of our lives together, just as it is for nature.

For the caterpillar to become a butterfly, it must die. For the tree to rest and bear fruit, it must lose its leaves with a dramatic flair. For humans, watching those we love move on in death (or myriad other ways) allows the space for new love to come.



As we walk together as a congregation, it is essential that we take time to process and grow, dream and revise, imagine and listen. Like the caterpillar, it is my hope that we can't even imagine the wonders God has in store for this little corner of Seattle. It's spring, and new life is coming. Have you planted your apple tree yet?

Holy Week Starts April 10

Palm/Passion Sunday | 9 am & 11 am. To begin Holy Week, we celebrate with palms Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and then transition to a telling of the Passion Story of Jesus' Journey to the Cross.

Maundy Thursday | 6 pm Soup Supper – 7 pm Communion. We gather for a simple meal and story, and then communion in silence and the stripping of the altar, remembering the last supper.

Good Friday 24 Hour Prayer Vigil | 12 pm Friday- 12 pm Saturday. (See details and sign up information in box below.)

Good Friday Worship | 7 pm Tenebrae & Prayer Around the Cross. We pray, sing, and reflect on the last words of Jesus in the Tenebrae, and then offer our prayers and song in the darkness around the cross, lighting candles.

Easter Sunrise Worship | 6:30 am at Carkeek Park. Bring your blanket, chair, and coffee to celebrate Christ at the crack of dawn with a bonfire and communion at Carkeek Park. New members and baptisms are part of the celebration.

Our Redeemer's Has Joined with Seattle Pride Against Anti-Transgender Attacks

Our Redeemer's has signed on to a statement by Seattle Pride against anti-trans attacks. This will be shared with those who are being targeted. The statement begins: "Seattle Pride is joined by our community partners in emphatically denouncing Texas Gov. Greg Abbott's transphobic attempt to criminalize gender affirming healthcare. Gov. Abbott's order only further stigmatizes the transgender community and prevents access to treatment that can prevent suicide and depression among transgender youth... We must stand together to prevent inaccurate, harmful, and hateful beliefs about the trans community. It is critical that we as a community stand against this transphobic attack on transgender youth and families."

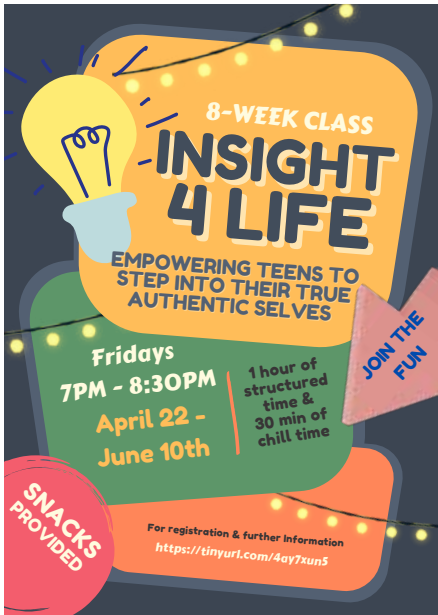

Transition Team Update

In March, Pastor Gretchen Mertes, Parish Administrator Karie Stearns and members of our Church Council’s executive team met with Bishop Shelley Bryan Wee and Assistant to the Bishop, Andy Yee, to discuss our staffing situation and upcoming transition process. In the next 6–8 weeks, the synod will be providing us a transition guide (which may or may not be an ordained person but will be trained in this specific ministry) The transition guide will lead us through a discernment process of what is next for us as a congregation in mission, call, and leadership. In the meantime, our council will appoint a transition team of 6–8 people in the next few weeks to work directly with the transition guide to help us navigate this time. Their work will culminate in a Ministry Site Profile, a document that describes Our Redeemer’s to prospective rostered ministers pursuing a call in our area. This process is not regimented on a timeline, and will take as long as it takes, and will rely on congregation input in a variety of ways. The more diligent we are, the faster it will move forward.

Separately, we have requested additional pastoral support for Pastor Gretchen from the synod in regard to preaching, adult forums, and some pastoral care during the interim. It may be a few months until this person is in place so we have taken it upon ourselves to find supply preachers at least through May. Pastor Gretchen is feeling very well attended to and supported so far, and is grateful for all your care and concern.

“The best thing you can do for me, and for the congregation, is to participate fully in the transition process, and stay active and involved in worship and congregational life,” says Pastor Gretchen.
