
In Christ was the world being reconciled to God, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. (2 Corinthians 5:19)





But the word of God is not chained. ¹⁰ Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. ¹¹ The saying is sure:

¹² if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he will also deny us;

¹³ if we are faithless, he remains faithful—

he cannot deny himself.




Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.




Youth Faith Formation - 10 AM Sundays
