ADVENT: A Season of Hope

As the days grow shorter, we lean into the darkness to see God's creativity, and glean part of the Creator's hope. This Advent season, starting today, we are using resources from Lutheran World Relief, an organization that we actively support and admire (www.lwr.org). LWR has given congregations the gift of **Advent Stories of Hope**. We will be learning the stories of people from Honduras, Nepal, Lebanon, and Sudan each week of Advent. Here are ways you can participate:

- Children will have the opportunity to bring a "noisy offering" – an offering of all the change they can find. **If you have jars of coins at home, bring them to worship**, and the kids will dump them into a bucket to be collected to support LWR.

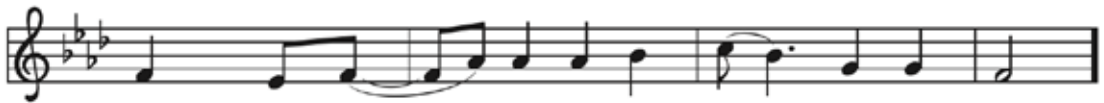

God of new life, you come among us in the places we least expect. Receive these prayers and those of our hearts, in the name of Jesus.

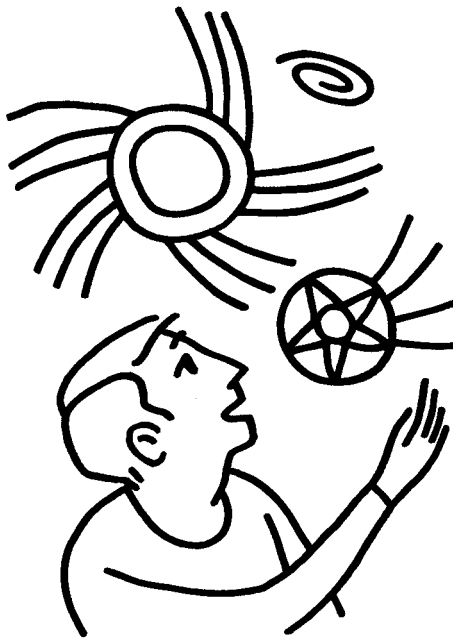

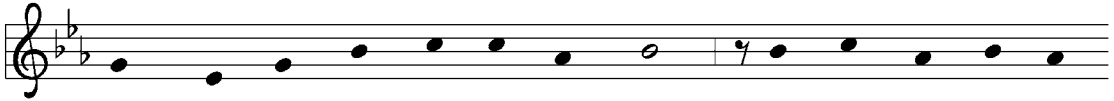

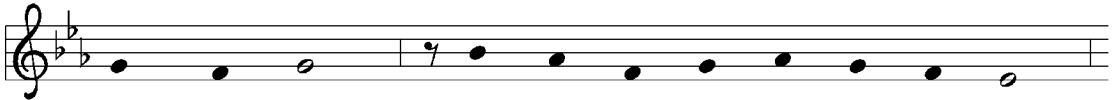
