INVITATION TO LENT

Friends in Christ, today with the whole church we enter the time of remembering Jesus' passover from death to life, and our life in Christ is renewed.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love—strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

CONFESSION OF SIN

Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

The assembly kneels or sits. Silence is kept for reflection and self-examination.

Most holy and merciful God,
we confess to you and to one another,
and before the whole company of heaven,
that we have sinned by our fault,
by our own fault,
by our own most grievous fault,
in thought, word, and deed,
by what we have done and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven. **Have mercy on us, O God.**

We have shut our ears to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

Our past unfaithfulness, the pride, envy, hypocrisy, and apathy that have infected our lives, we confess to you.

Have mercy on us, O God.

Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people, we confess to you. **Have mercy on us, O God.**

Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to share the faith that is in us, we confess to you.

Have mercy on us, O God.

Our neglect of human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty, we confess to you.

Have mercy on us, O God.

Our false judgments, our uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, we confess to you.

Have mercy on us, O God.

Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us, we confess to you.

Have mercy on us, O God.

Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.

Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.




Gathered into one in the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us:



Adult Education Lord, Teach Us To Pray: Adult Forums in Lent with Dana Wright Sundays, February 21 thru March 29 - 9:30 AM

- February 21: "Our Father Who Art in Heaven, Hallowed Be Thy Name." Jesus begins his instructive prayer by orienting the disciples to the creative origin of all life and blessedness, the Father in heaven.
- March 1: "Thy Kingdom Come, Thy Will Be Done, on Earth as It Is in Heaven." The disciples are to prayer for God's heavenly authority and power to come to earth.
- March 8: "Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread." Moving downward to the very nitty gritty of human existence, the prayer recognizes God as the source of earthly, embodied, existence.
- March 15: "Forgive Us Our Debts as We Forgive Our Debtors." Human beings cannot live by bread alone but by the Word of God taking root deeply within our spirits where ongoing forgiveness is essential.
- March 22: "Lead Us Not into Temptation but Deliver Us from Evil." The prayer moves down deeper into the place where the issues of life come up again and again.
- March 29: "For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power and the Glory Forever, Amen." This phrase was probably added to the prayer to make it suitable to formal worship. But we might also understand this phrase in light of Irenaeus' wonderful phrase: The glory of God is humanity fully alive."
