glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen!** (*Romans 15:6*)



## WORD

### FIRST READING

1 Corinthians 2:1-13, 16

Faith comes from what is heard,  
**and what is heard comes through the Word of Christ.** (*Romans 10:17*)

Hear what the Spirit is saying.  
**Our ears and hearts are open.**

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the testimony of God to you with superior speech or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were made not with persuasive words of wisdom but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are being destroyed. But we speak God's wisdom, a hidden mystery, which God decreed before the ages for our glory and which none of the rulers of this age understood, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written,

“What no eye has seen, nor ear heard,  
nor the human heart conceived,  
what God has prepared for those who love him”—

God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For what human knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. And we speak of these things in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual things to those who are spiritual.

“For who has known the mind of the Lord  
so as to instruct him?”

But we have the mind of Christ.

Holy Wisdom, Holy Word.

The holy gospel of our Lord, Jesus Christ, according to Matthew.

For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.”



In this hour-long service, we are lead in singing a mix of traditional hymns and contemporary music. We hear a challenging and thoughtful message, pray together and take communion. Children are welcome and, for the little ones, our staffed nursery is open.

### **11 AM Traditional Worship | In-person & Online**

The 11:00 am service is liturgy deeply rooted in the Lutheran tradition of God's living word. Join together in prayer, familiar hymns and communion at God's all-welcoming table, and hear a thoughtful message from Pastor Thomas that you can carry into your week. We wish one another peace and blessings and leave the service more connected, challenged and hopeful than before.

- The Nursery is available Sunday mornings, newborn to age 4.
- The "Prayground" in the sanctuary is available to families with little ones. This intentional space helps them participate fully in worship in a way that is developmentally appropriate.



### **Holy Grieving**

As we come into this year, much has happened in our public life and private lives that is cause for grief. Grief can present itself in many forms, and grief can grow smaller or heal, but it is nearly always present at different times in our lives. We are not whole in grief until it has become part of our living—something that angers us, challenges us to find values, boundaries, or beliefs that have been transgressed or affronted, or something that brings sadness or loneliness carries with it the wrestling with loss, and sense of identity and community.

**Wherever you may be in the scheme of grief, please come share a moment of mutual support and care.** This will not be a service, per se, but a moment of guided meditation, to coalesce around our thoughts and feelings in dealing with loss, anger, sadness, fear, pain, lament and loneliness.
