*CHRIST, OUR LIGHT, OUR PASSOVER

A flame is carried from the new fire (lit at today's Sunrise Service) to light the new Paschal (Passover) Candle, signifying the new creation in Christ and new year of resurrection light. The Candle is lit on days commemorating the dead, special occasions when the Holy Spirit and Light of Christ are celebrated, and at baptisms.

A bell is rung 8 times, signifying the resurrection day, the day of the new covenant—the "eighth day"—and the first day of the new creation.

*BAPTISMAL REMEMBRANCE

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

We were buried with him by baptism into death, as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we also walk in newness of life.

If the dead are not raised,

then Christ has not been raised.

If Christ has not been raised,

our faith is futile, and we are still in our sins.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead,

the first fruits of those who have died.

We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, so we might no longer be enslaved to sin.

We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again;

death no longer has dominion over him.

Sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—not the result of works, so that no one may boast.

For we are what he has made us, created in Christ ⊕ Jesus for good works.

From now on, therefore,

we regard no one from a human point of view;

even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view,

we no longer know him in that way.

So if anyone is in Christ,

there is a new creation:

everything old has passed away;

look, new things have come into being!

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing,

but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

We proclaim Christ crucified,

a stumbling block for those who trust in signs and foolishness to those who trust in wisdom, but to those who are called

Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God.

And, if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

Alleluia! The Lord is risen!

Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!


*PRAYER OF THE DAY

A reading from First Corinthians.


19 If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

reveal to us the Risen Christ.




Lutheran World Relief: Spring Collection Needs
