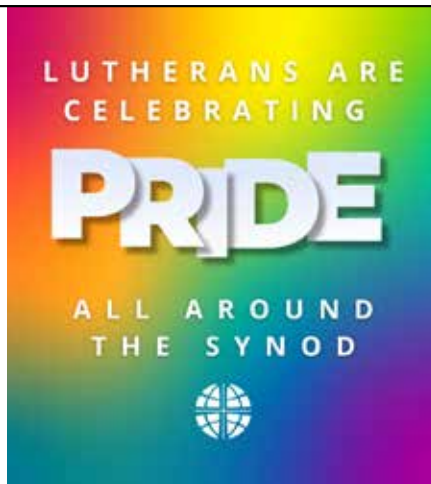
Season of Pride & Pride Parade Sunday June 29th
