*REMEMBERING BAPTISM

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

For by grace ♣ you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—not the result of works, so that no one may boast.

For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works.

So if anyone is in Christ,

there is a new creation:

everything old has passed away;

look, new things have come into being!

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing,

but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.


We proclaim a crucified Christ, a stumbling block for those who trust in signs and foolishness to those who trust in wisdom, but to those who are called

FIRST READING Acts 16:9-15

Hear what the Spirit is saying:

⁹ During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." ¹⁰ When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them

¹¹We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, ¹² and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. ¹³ On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. ¹⁴ A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. ¹⁵ When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

Come, whether this is your first time or your hundredth.


Come, because this simple feast is a reminder that God's Table is big enough for all of us. And thanks be to God, all have a place at this table.





Our Redeemer's offers movies for youth, kids, and families monthly on a Saturday afternoon. These gatherings offer entertainment, connection, and meaningful conversation.


