

Lent: Restore Us by Pastor David

As we enter the sacred season of Lent, the theme that I invite us to resonate through our hearts and echoes in our prayers is "Restore Us." Lent is a journey of reflection, repentance, and renewal—a pilgrimage of the soul where we honestly seek God's transformative touch.

In these forty days, we embark on a profound exploration of restoration, both individually and as a community. The psalmist's cry, "Restore to me the joy of your salvation" (Ps. 51:12) and, "Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved!" (Psalm 80:3), becomes our collective plea, uniting us in the pursuit of spiritual rejuvenation.

Reflection on Brokenness: Lent invites us to confront our brokenness, acknowledging the areas of our lives and community where we have strayed from God's intended path. It's an opportunity to pause, examine our hearts, and confess our shortcomings. In recognizing our need for restoration, we open ourselves to the healing grace of God.

The Journey of Repentance: Repentance is not merely remorse but a turning back to God, a changing of our minds in alignment with God's grace and love. It's a deliberate choice to relinquish our lives to Christ's purpose. As we journey through Lent, let us humbly repent, seeking God's forgiveness with open hearts. 

- Sprouts is a faith program for children ages 3–5, taught by the wonderful Mr. Dana during the 9:00 am service.
- O-Rock, which stands for Our Redeemer's Outstanding Church Kids, is our faith program for kids ages 6-10. It is taught by a rotating group of wonderful volunteers and is held between services from 10:00 – 11:00 am
- Confirmation class, led by Stephanie Fowler and Michael Hammett, runs throughout the year and is for middle school youth in grades 7 and 8.



Andrew Shimer leads an engaging game of D&D and is responsible for planning and leading monthly youth nights of fun and food.

In my role as the lead for Youth Faith Formation, I've been asked about not running the children's program concurrently with both services. O-Rock and Confirmation are scheduled at 10:00 am to allow parents to participate in the between-service Adult Faith Formation classes. We believe strongly that children should be part of worship, even if they are coloring in the back.

What is Pastoral Care?

Many times in our lives, we find ourselves struggling with our relationship with God, and how God pertains to our lives. The struggle may come from a loss – a loss of relationship through death, divorce or estrangement, the loss of a job or career, the loss of health or well-being. The struggle may come from changes – becoming a parent, or having children leave home, a change in our friendships or goals, having to move or relocate for various reasons.

Whenever we are facing questions or struggles, pastoral care is an option for us. Pastors are trained to listen, pray, and be present with their parishioners in different situations. To be clear, most pastors are not therapists or counselors, but they are good listeners and know how to refer people who need further care to seek professional guidance.

When you are dealing with a situation that would benefit from pastoral care, please reach out and let us know. If there is a death, or someone is hospitalized, please call! Your pastor will come to be with you and pray any time of the day or night. If



you are having a less time-sensitive struggle, reach out and schedule time together to pray and connect. Our pastor is also available by phone, email and text to pray and check in.

One of the best ways our congregation provides pastoral care outside of direct conversation with the pastor is through our Caring Community Team who provides meal assistance, caring cards, and prayer. We also have Emmaus Visitors, who care for our homebound members, bringing communion and companionship to them monthly. Our prayer team also can pray for those whose needs are acute, via email or phone.

Pastoral care is a gift of being part of a congregation that many people aren't aware of, or don't know when to ask for in their lives. Please don't hesitate – this is one of the best ways we can stay connected and engaged when life throws us a curve ball. Thanks be to God.
