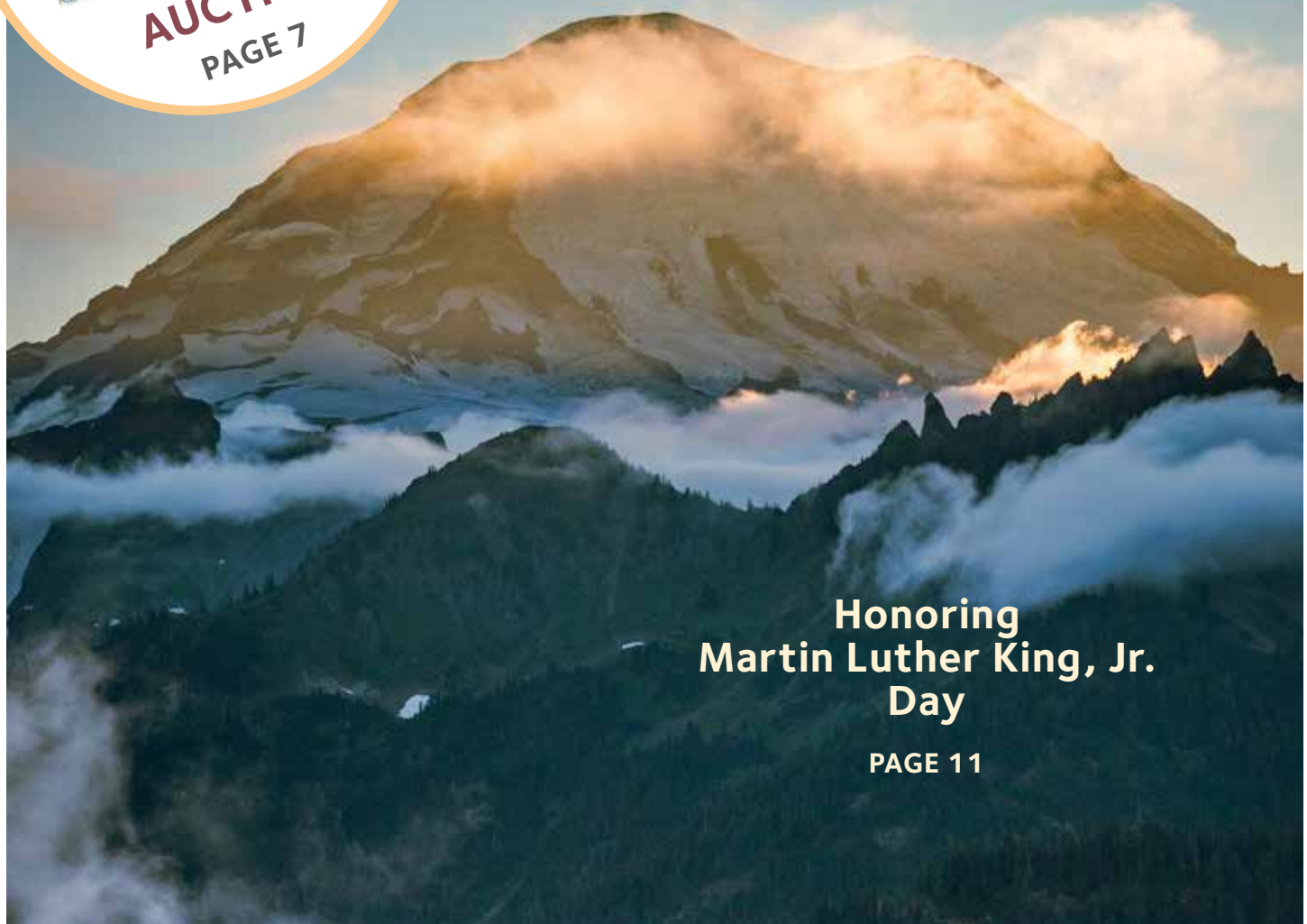

# From the Pastor...

Revelation 21:3-5

<sup>3</sup> And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'See, the home of God is among mortals. God will dwell with them; they will be God's people, and God will indeed be with them;'  
<sup>4</sup> God will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.'

<sup>5</sup> And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' Also, this one said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.'

I remember in January of 2021 saying, "This year is going to be SO much better than last!" ...and there were so many parts of it that have been great: Easter sunrise service at Carkeek Park with wonderful new members; getting to lead worship from the beautiful sanctuary of nature; presiding at tiny in-person weddings; worship in my front yard!; finally gathering in our beautiful, purposeful, intentional building; and singing together at Christmas.

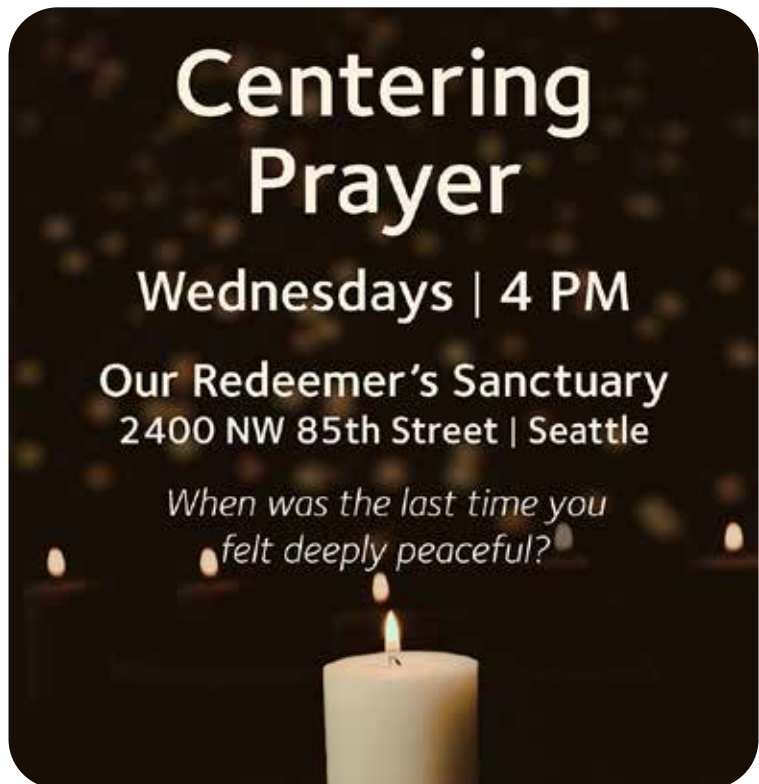

4th Tuesday of each month, 7 PM | Reuben's Brews, 5010 14th Ave NW

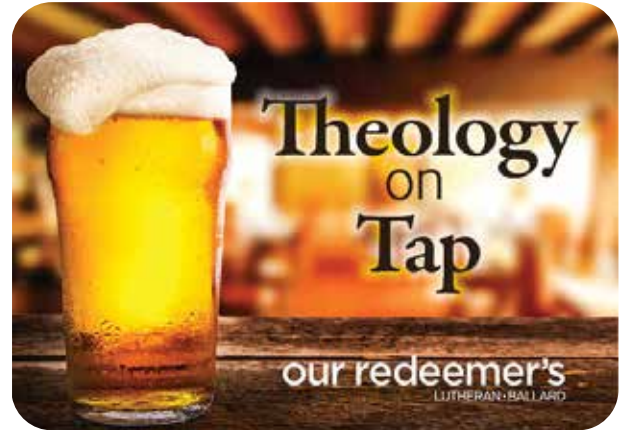
