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A Community in the Model of Christ

From the Pastor...

Romans 6:3-5 – Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

As I've been pondering the transition (upon transition, upon transition) that Our Redeemer's has been going through, and even now has embarked on yet another transition this month with Pastor Kathy's retirement, the same image keeps coming up in my prayers for us – that of a chrysalis.



When a caterpillar creates its chrysalis, it does so without knowing that it is completely dismantling itself, turning to unrecognizable goo, only to re-emerge as something it may not have even dreamed about.

A well-known symbol in Christianity as a symbol of the resurrection, the butterfly represents new life emerging from death. And this is something we can look forward to in the future, but we are definitely not there yet – thus, the chrysalis. How fitting for us to be entering our congregational transition time in Lent! Perhaps this 'in-between time' could be thought of as being cocooned in God's love, changing from one thing to the next, not knowing what will come, but trusting in the process.

There are many things we don't know about the future, and this congregation's path. But I'd like to speak to what we do know:

1. **God is faithful**, and we are called to this community for a reason – to be "in the model of Christ for the life of the world." That looks like:

social justice and advocacy, caring for those who are hurting, praising God at every opportunity, and spending time together at table. We are good at this and will continue to grow in service to God and others.

2. **We are strong in God's love.** This is a devoted community that holds each other together through change and growth. I've seen it, time and again! This period of transition will be one that creates fear and worry, but it can also be a time of great anticipation and hope. God has abundant plans for us that include JOY and STRETCHING. We will be STRETCHED in this interim – and while that may be uncomfortable, like an adolescent with long legs they're not used to, it will lead to blessing. I pray that when we get worried or find ourselves mired in fear, that we can release those burdens, and ask for JOY in its place.
3. **We have a great staff, council, and teams** working hard to keep the congregation shipshape. They could use your help! If you have the capacity or desire to serve on a team, or in senior leadership, this is a great time to step up. We will be forming two new teams soon – a transition team and a call team. In your prayers, ask God to open your heart to serving at church – especially in the next year.
4. **Our synod is working hard on our behalf** to find us a great interim, and then a great new pastoral leader. It's a very involved process, and we have strong advocates in our bishop and her staff. Thanks be to God!

As we move through this season of yet more transition, it is my prayer that we have grace for each other in the messy goo of the chrysalis, knowing that our time of new life is on the horizon!

Holy Week Preview April 10-17

Palm/Passion Sunday | 9am

& 11am. To begin Holy Week, we celebrate with palms Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and then transition to a telling of the Passion Story of Jesus' Journey to the Cross.

Maundy Thursday | 6pm Soup Supper – 7pm Communion.

We gather for a simple meal and story, and then communion in silence and the stripping of the altar, remembering the last supper.

Good Friday 24 Hour Prayer Vigil | 12pm Friday- 12pm

Saturday. Our community prays each of the hours of the vigil either at church (in the prayer chapel), or at home. You can sign up for an hour, available soon.

Good Friday Worship | 7pm Tenebrae & Prayer Around the

Cross. We pray, sing, and reflect on the last words of Jesus in the Tenebrae, and then offer our prayers and song in the darkness around the cross, lighting candles.

Lenten Devotional: Give Something Up? Or... Take Something On!

Each year we enter into the season of Lent. The tradition of Lent is to fast, give offerings, and pray excessively. Many Christians make a daily sacrifice in Lent. Some people give up eating meat, or having caffeine drinks or alcohol. The idea of self-sacrifice is meant to help people notice something more important than food, or drink. We remember that Jesus went to the wilderness for forty days without eating.

There is another way to honor Lent. Instead of “giving up” something – or in addition to “giving up” something – you can ADD something.

Every day of Lent can be a time of new options. Our Redeemer's will provide a daily email devotion. There will be a Bible Verse, a Word for the Day, a Question, and a Prayer. These will not be long. But you may spend all day thinking about these things, if you choose.

The next steps, if you have time or energy, is to: Take a picture of something you discover that goes with the Bible Verse or Word. Do some exercises while thinking of the Question or Prayer. Cook something and give it away. Make a card or write a letter and send it to someone who needs to hear from you. Watch a really inspiring movie* or listen to wonderful music**. Take time to rest. As a challenge, write a better HAIKU than the one I wrote about Lent:

*Prayer and Fasting
Generosity Abounds
For God's sake and mine.*

**Music I like to hear: Handel's Messiah, Cat Stevens' "Tea for the Tillerman" and "Buddha and the Chocolate Box" albums, Andrew Lloyd Weber's Requiem, Faure's Requiem, (any Requiem).

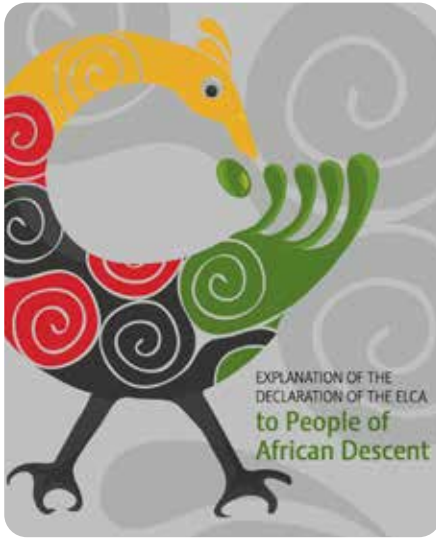
Regardless of whether you join or not, the Journey is a wonderful way to become more fully involved in this church family. No strings attached.

Now Is the Time: A Study Guide for the ELCA Declaration to People of African Descent

This Lent, we are going to take an intentional deep dive into the ELCA's new social statement on race in America. This study guide provides an avenue for the "realization, self-examination, and accountability required to 'apologize to people of African descent for the church's complicity in slavery and its enduring legacy of racism in the United States and globally.'"

As the community of Christ in our neighborhood, we are being offered an opportunity to read, discuss, learn from, and struggle with this statement and everything it implies for us as a primarily white Lutheran congregation. We recommend that you read it, print it out, mark it up, and bring your thoughts and questions and feelings with you to this study. The sessions will be led by Elizabeth Dickinson, Marie Brissette, and Pastor Gretchen. We hope that you will enter in to this transformative study with an open heart.

Pastor Gretchen is more than happy to help with whatever pastoral care needs you might have in the interim and moving forward together in ministry. Please don't hesitate to reach out to the office with questions or to clarify what is appropriate. May God's peace be with us all.



What to Expect in the Transition

Here's is what we currently know about the transition process. A more precise timeline will be forthcoming:

- An Interim/Transition Pastor arrives to oversee the transition process and help provide pastoral leadership.
- A Transition Team will be formed to clarify our mission, strengths of congregational temperament, demographics, etc.
- A Call Committee Formed: Using what the Transition Team has discovered, the Call Committee interviews the candidates will be forwarded to us by the Synod.
- The Assistant to the Bishop will also be assisting and guiding us through this process.

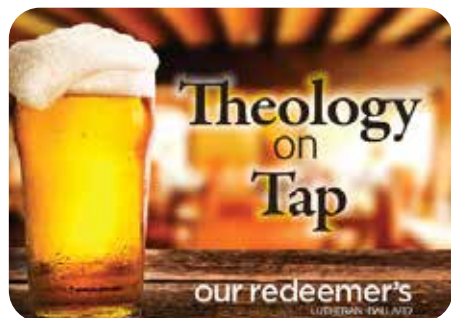
- Live Music from "The Feels" – a rockin' vintage country duo!

Facilities Task Force Members Needed

Now that we have successfully completed a beautiful building remodel, we want to keep it looking beautiful and we're looking to you to help!

There are three areas related to the building where facility teams are needed:

1. **A group that carries on where the VAB left off**, taking the recommendations from VAB, following through on those and looking to the future of what we need. This is higher level and would involve some meetings, all of which can be virtual.
2. **On-the-ground help**. We do not have a custodian and need help with building tasks such as: lightbulb replacement, basic fix-it projects, picking up the grounds when there is need (litter), help getting quotes for any work that needs to be done. This team would most likely not involve any meetings and would be working directly with the Parish Administrator.
3. **Rentals task force**. We are looking to utilize the building for congregational and community needs. We need help creating a presence on the website for rentals with pictures, FAQs, rental agreements, pricing, etc., and could use your help. This task force might attend a few meetings but isn't obligatory. The rentals task force will be a short term obligation. Once we have met the 3-4 goals, the task force's obligations are complete.

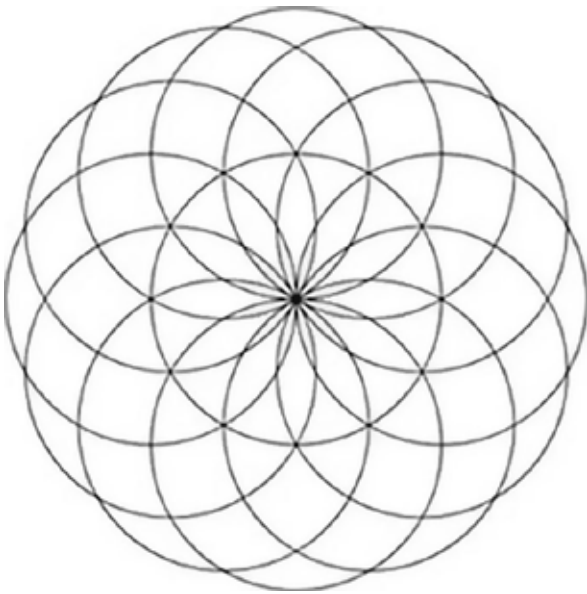


Social Justice

Looking Back on Our Stories of Faith and Social Justice

*"Faith bears fruit in love.
To me, faith is taking action."*

Sonja Braasch shared this in one of the four Sacred Storytelling – Social Justice conversations held in the past two months. These rich conversations are part of the process to shape our congregation's social justice goals for the next five years. We hope that identifying our church's social justice plan will both reinvigorate our commitments and strengthen the effort to find a new pastor and create a church profile.



Here's a peek at some of what we shared in these conversations. **We hope these ideas inspire you, and encourage you to share your own thoughts.**

We began by asking participants to tell a story about a meaningful way they have chosen to *"act justly, love kindness, and walk humbly with God"* (Micah 6:8). We heard about:

Reading to children at a school that has many immigrants, bringing mass to a Washington State penitentiary, making community meals for those without homes or enough to eat, trail work at Carkeek Park and the beach clean-up, serving Thanksgiving dinner, book groups on racial justice, teaching literacy to adults, Habitat for Humanity in Nicaragua, advocating for bills with the state legislature, and trading stories with people we are serving through Safe Parking or at Thanksgiving.

We also wondered: **what do you appreciate about Our Redeemer's social justice and direct service ministries?**

We heard these appreciations:

- Ministries are rooted in love, justice, respect, equality in God's eyes, dignity, compassion, and humility.
- Faith calls people into relationships with each other. The church nurtures members and helps members nurture others.
- When our children hear the prayers of the people, they hear us praying for the whole world and all of humanity. That will impact their frame of reference for a lifetime.
- Helping with Ballard Sunday Dinner gives me a sense of hope instead of dread when encountering those without homes.
- Being a Reconciling In Christ congregation is wonderful! It feels good to walk into our church that welcomes anybody and everybody.
- Bible study and The Journey helped me understand what faith means and how it inspires action toward social justice.
- Doing social justice activities with others at church has been a significant way for me to build community.
- I got to watch Thanksgiving guests begin to let down their guard and relax.
- The earth care retreat provides connection and the feeling of being alive.
- We have been privileged to receive the gift of sacred encounters: deeply meeting other children of God and gaining understanding and insight from hearing others' stories.
- Being outdoors taking care of the Earth helps me grow in faith as I think about God, pause, and reflect.

- How have you/we grown and changed through our social justice engagement?

- Communion at an open table where "all are welcome" is a statement of faith and a political/cultural statement about the worth and dignity of all.
- Doing social justice as a church enables me to get involved in causes that would be difficult to begin or do alone. It creates a sense of making a difference.
- Taking action is an expression of hope. Opportunities to practice faith as a community offer me hope.

We hope these ideas inspire you, and encourage you to share your own thoughts.

We look forward to more Sacred Storytelling sessions, including special guest speakers in May.
