From the Pastor...

One of the things that make transitions challenging is the notion of uncertainty amid so many possibilities.

The vast and wide road ahead, alongside the dynamics of not knowing what exactly is ahead can make for disruptive and anxious times.

And just like the communities of faith and faithful people before us, what we do know is that we're in it together, that God is, somewhere, alongside of us, nudging us and encouraging us along.

During times of transition one note of clarity that helps to manage this uncertainty is the assurance of who we are, what we call identity, as God's people. While many of us want to quickly organize for purpose, longing for a clear and concise mission statement, it is, in actuality, our identity, our very ways of being as God's people that gives us fertile ground for growing in a particular direction. So, from the urgency to create strategies and plans for "doing" more, it is, in fact, counterintuitive to first pause and explore, with the best of curiosity, who we are.

For moderns whose efficacy is self-sufficient determinacy this counterintuitive 'pause' may seem lazy and fruitless.

And yet, this is precisely why sabbath has been such a staple for God's people. It is not merely resting from our labors, it is resting in patient waiting for God's Word about us.

Martin Luther writes about this in his explanation to the third commandment on the Sabbath: "we are to fear and love God so that we do not despise God's Word, or neglect it, but gladly hear and learn it."

Times of transition, as in every epoch of faith communities long before us, are determined by this willingness to lean into the common identity of God's presence in Word, whether the people of Israel in Exodus or Exile, the disciples learning and listening to the living, breathing Word/Christ, or the early church being amazed at God's deeds of power through the Holy Spirit.

In this time of transition, I guess my question for us is how will we, collectively and individually, pause to listen to one another, and to God's Word among us, and to resist the anxiety that doing all the things equates with being faithful?

The Good News is that there are more than enough opportunities for us as God's faithful people to slow down and listen, to receive God's Word gladly and to hear and learn it.

This is to keep the main thing the main thing. For as in any community, seeking to be the best that it can be, its truest source of power is its identity, who it is. We who are called by Christ and the Spirit to be church in this place and time are continually being called to listen. Let us be drawn to be in tune with listening ears to the resonance of God's Spirit already in our midst.

October 30, 11 AM - Confirmation

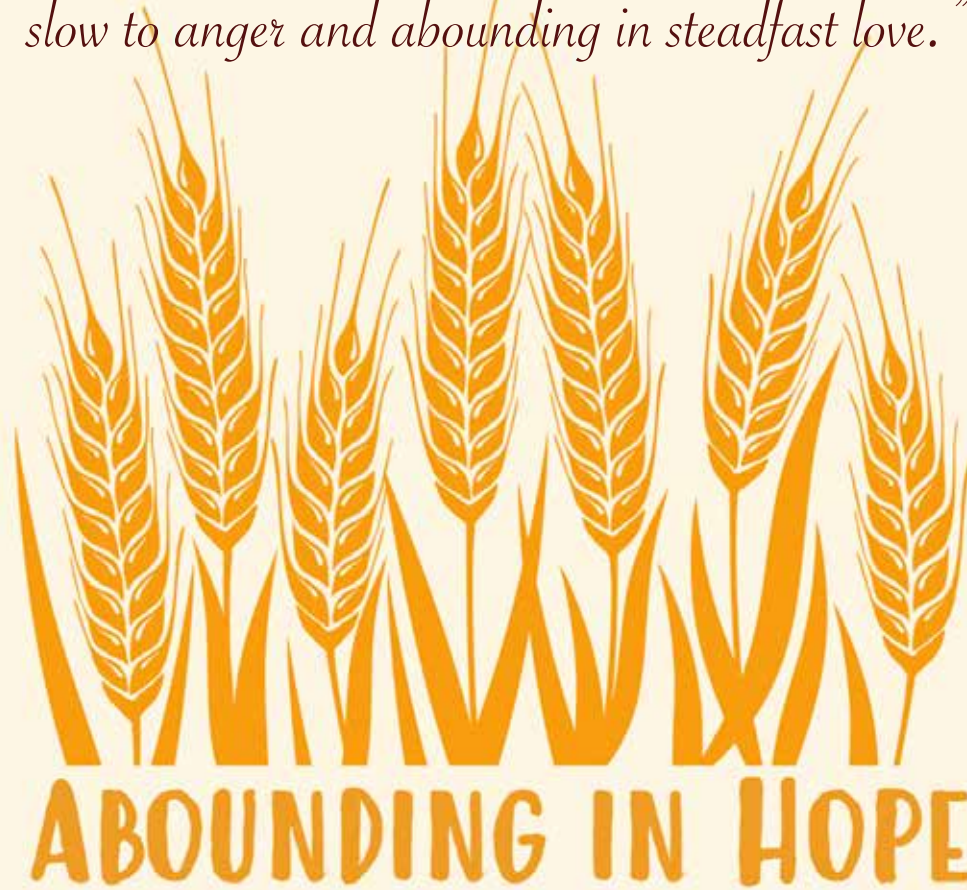

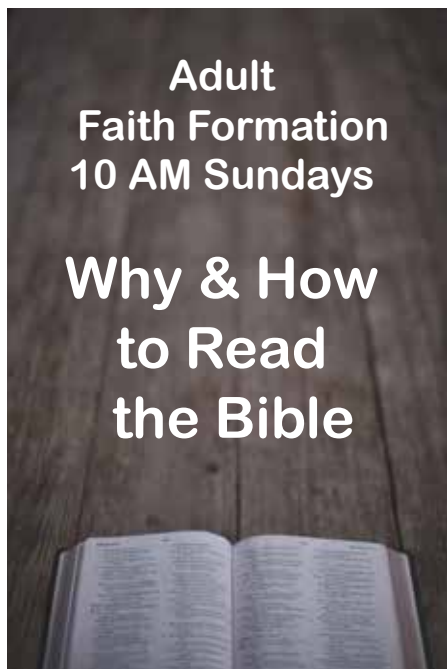

October Adult Faith Formation: Why and How to Read the Bible?

In times of transition, the people of God consistently turn to God, waiting for God's address of comfort, direction, and promises. **There are a variety of ways people of faith listen to God; one primary way has been through the reading of the Bible.** This comes, however, with significant questions for us as modern folks. The assumptions of our worldviews seem to clash, and be in opposition to the simple reading of the Bible as Scripture and God's Word, not to mention the challenging texts that characterize God and God's people as retributive, war-mongering patriarchs.

How can we read the Bible faithfully as Christians? Why is it even necessary to turn to Scripture, especially in times of transition? Why and how is it this a faithful practice?

Come and wrestle with us in October's adult formation time around the whys and hows of reading the Bible for our time and place as faithful, and emerging Christian leaders.

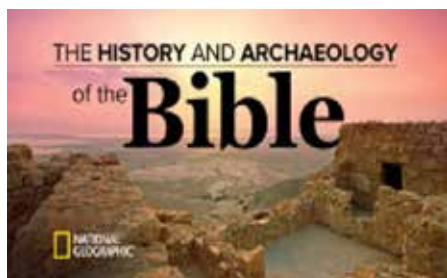


Psalms for Autumn - In-Person Bible Study

Native American Heritage Day (aka Indigenous People's Day) by Lars Sveum-Hanson

Native American Heritage Day, also known as Indigenous People's Day, is the 4th Friday of September or the 2nd Monday of October depending on which state is observing! (Canada has a First Nations day on June 21st, Summer Solstice.) **This special day is designated to appreciate native cultures and help heal past hurts of indigenous nations both local and worldwide.**

Most Native nations seek to live in harmony with our Creator and all of creation, our Mother Earth:

"Mataku Oyaci! All my relatives be blessed: the 2-leggeds, the 4-leggeds, the wingeds and the rooteds!" (Lacotah prayer)

"I love these people that live by the 10 commandments without ever hearing about them!", George Catlin commented as he painted and told stories of several tribes for the Smithsonian in the early 1800s, just after Lewis and Clark made their "Voyage of Discovery" of the Louisiana Purchase.

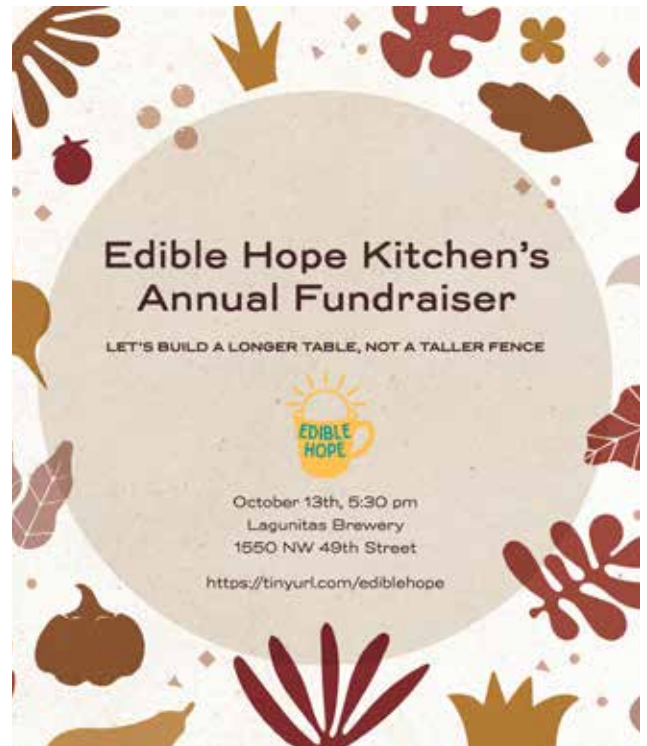
In 1990, South Dakota proclaimed a year of "truth & reconciliation" to commemorate the centennial of the massacre at Wounded Knee. Native American Heritage Day is now observed as a replacement of Columbus Day. Several states have followed South Dakota with an observance on the 2nd Monday of October. President Biden declared this a national day of observance in 2021.

American Indians have suffered pain and hurt from years of poverty and being marginalized and abused in America. **As Lutherans, we need to pray for energy and imagination to be a pro-active ally of our Native American friends, members and neighbors!** Our Racial Justice Advocates marched with the families of Murdered & Missing Indigenous Women at Othello Park and helped advocate for a new Washington state amber alert system. 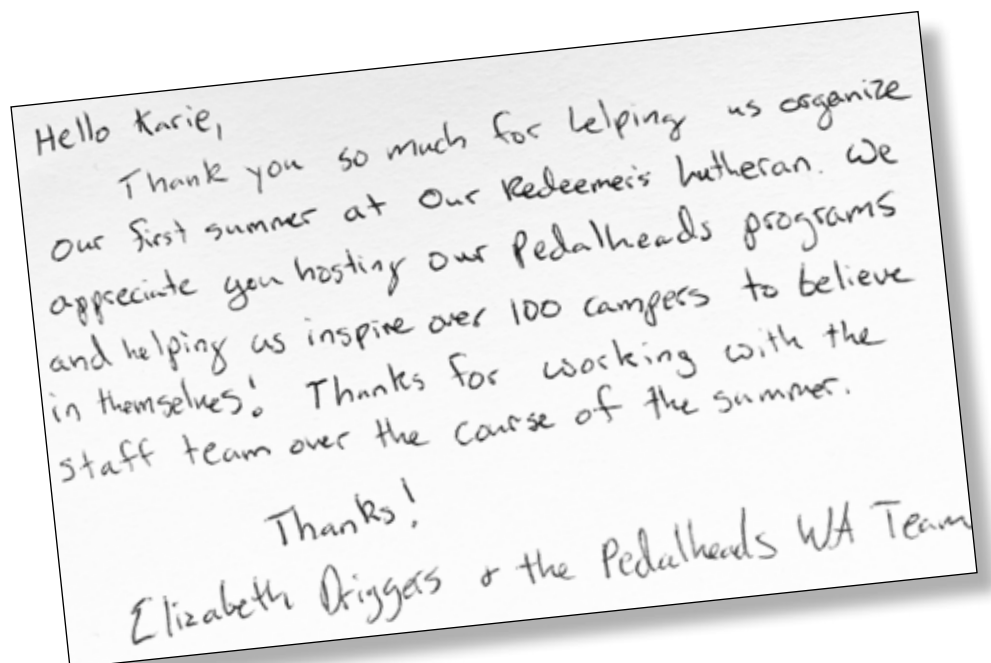
We welcome all youth ages 5 through 18 to participate in this festival of light and hope for the Christmas season.

Ever since our doors reopened after COVID and the remodel, we've had visitors try out our church almost every single Sunday.

I know for those of you who are very introverted in nature, the thought of initiating and carrying on a conversation with a stranger might be akin to that recurring dream where you show up to class completely naked - not something you'd voluntarily do.

But I'm really encouraging each and every one of us to make it our mission to seek out new faces and extend the hospitable love of Christ to them!

Research tells us that in looking for a new church, **the number one things people are seeking is a community to belong to.** So, let's see how we can better make visitors and new folks feel welcomed into our community!

What do you think? Can we make an effort to extend the hospitality of Christ to the new faces we see this month? Let's do it!

So, here's a script with some questions you could utilize:

- "Hi. I don't think we've met before. I'm ____."
- *(Because it's hard to know who is new post-Covid)* "Have you been attending here long?"
- "How did you hear about this church?"
- "Do you live close by?"
- "Have you lived in Seattle long?"
- Or when all else fails: "I love your ____!" *(Compliments at least make people feel seen.)*
