From the Pastor...

Return to the Lord your God, for God is gracious and merciful. – Joel 2:13

Happy fall, dear people of Our Redeemer's! I hope and pray that your summer was refreshing, filled with warmth, connection, and a chance to breathe deeply and appreciate the glory of God's creation we find all around us, from the beaches to the backyards.

I have had the wonderful chance over the last few years to truly develop my appreciation and knowledge of the wonders of the low tide of the Salish Sea. From sea stars and anemones to nudibranchs and urchins, I find that the many creatures are mysterious and wonderful – albeit sometimes a little slimy. The key to seeking out these creatures is knowing when, where and how to look. 

The LiVE Project is: a networked lay learning community discerning God's call; theologically thoughtful, culturally responsive, and communally engaged; connecting churches and forming Christian public leaders; a flexible, hybrid model of learning: zoom and face to face.

Carolyn says: "I hope you can catch the tone of excitement I have in bringing this course to us. Called The History and Archaeology of the Bible, taught by a man of faith, we will experience over and over the miraculous event of Jesus entering our world and the work of the Holy Spirit continuing in us to this very moment.



Revealed will be eye-opening perspectives on Biblical narratives such as: the flood, the ark, the spiritual meaning of towers; the Kingship of David, evidence supporting the story of Samuel; Israel under the Assyrians. Also included are the New Testament stories of Jesus, his birth, his early life, and the Roman world in which he lived. Continuing, this study examines the world of the Gospels, the Passover Events in Jerusalem, and the rise of Christianity."

The LiVE Project: Living Into Vocational Engagement

The LiVE Project is a new initiative of the NW WA Synod, and offers some great adult faith formation opportunities for us throughout the year. Its emphasis is to support lay leaders who wish to deepen their sense of call in daily life, and as congregational leaders.

We came by this opportunity because pastor David, our Transition Facilitator, is heading this up. What this means is that **anybody**, **and any teams in our congregation**, **can join at any time during the all of the course offerings**. The courses are on Zoom as well as in-person. Take a New Eye-Opening Look at the Bible

WHEN: Each Wednesday at 10:30 am until noon beginning September 14.

WHAT: The History and Archaeology of the Bible. We will delve into the iconic stories of the Bible through the eyes of historians and archeologists and discover how their findings bring fascinating and revealing perspectives to the world-shaping texts of Scripture.

WHY: The Bible has impacted our culture perhaps more than any other written work. Whether we know it or not, its influence on our religious, spiritual, and philosophical conceptions; our notions of morality and social justice; and on Western art, literature, and history would be hard to exaggerate. Of course, the Bible is not a history book. It's a book of faith, and, above all its writings have religious and spiritual intent. Yet, each of its stories originated in a particular place and time, and many of them intersect meaningfully with what we know about the ancient world.

HOW: By Zoom. Wherever you are in this world, you can receive the link to this study. It is a rare opportunity to open up the work of historians and archaeologists as they bring their methods and insights to bear on the beloved narratives of the Bible. Throughout, the lessons are enriched with 3D models, hundreds of vibrant images, and many of the greatest works of Western art.

WHO: Taught by Jean-Pierre Isbouts, a National Geographic contributor, eminent biblical historian and award-winning filmmaker, these 24 detailed lessons include 47 video sequences, bringing alive key narratives of the Bible and their historical settings, and taking us to ancient places such as: the spot on Mt. Sinai where tradition says God spoke to Moses; the renowned Roman trade crossroads of Petra; the Roman Scythopolis; and the Mount of Beatitudes, held to be the spot where Jesus delivered his great sermon.

It's Not a Gargoyle! by Kristine Leander, Ph.D. (Member of Our Redeemer's since 1982) It's not a gargoyle. It's not even scary, once you know its meaning.



"The Musician" is the statue currently hanging on the south wall at Our Redeemer's, looking toward the front door. It's a replica of a sculpture that has hung in Norway's national cathedral in Trondheim probably since the 14th Century. Hundreds of years ago, when countries such as France, Germany, Sweden and Norway were building cathedrals, itinerant craftsmen traveled around and lent their skills to the process. The actual completion could take several centuries, and incorporated the work of scads of unknown craftsmen. That's why no one knows exactly who created the original Musician or where the sculptor came from.

It is known that during that era, musicians were looked down upon. They were considered lower class—so low, in fact, that they were not allowed near the sacred altar of the cathedral. Perhaps the sculptor himself was also a musician? By creating the Musician and placing it inside the chancel of the Cathedral, near the altar, he was saying, "All belong at the altar of God, no matter what others think of you, what you look like or what you do."

Our Redeemer's came to own the replica thanks to a gift from a Norwegian couple, Ola Kai and Marit Ledang, in 1984. They lived in Ballard for a year and knew that joining a church was the best way to get involved in a community. They brought the Musician to give to whatever church they joined. Warmly welcomed by members of Our Redeemer's, they soon joined and Ola Kai sang in the choir.

After various placements around the church, around 2000 a committee was formed and a consultant hired to find the best place for the Musician. It was hung on the north side of the sanctuary, not inside the chancel but at least looking in toward the altar. The Dean of Trondheim Cathedral, the Rev. Knut Andresen, accepted our invitation to come in 2001 and bless the sculpture in its new location. Airline tickets were purchased, plans were made, but 9/11 happened and no one felt safe traveling. Plans were abandoned.

The Musician's message—"All are welcome at the altar of God"—reflects the work that Our Redeemer's has done to become a Reconciling in Christ congregation, our work on behalf of unhoused people, our Sunday dinners, etc. It's time for Our Redeemer's to form another committee, hire a consultant—if that's what it takes—and find the very best place for the Musician to announce his message, "All are welcome at the altar of God." Hey, maybe we can get the current vicar from Trondheim to come for a blessing too! I'm willing to help work on it.

Transition Team Update by Pastor David Hahn

We celebrated the installation of the Transition Team during the August 7 worship. First and foremost, we invite you to keep the team members in your prayers as they begin the important transitional work on behalf of all of us at Our Redeemer's: Bob Carlson, Kari Guddal, Michael Hammett, Lars Svenholm Hanson, and Meagan Minus.

The team is currently in the first phase of the listening work. This process involves requesting feedback from the congregation to give some initial self-awareness of who we are as a community of faith, and the kind of leadership we believe God is calling us to invite to walk with us into a new future. The responses will help to develop the Ministry Site Profile (MSP).

The MSP is a two-part snapshot: Step 1) How we see ourselves as a congregation (the work of the Transition Team) and Step 2) What we are looking for in rostered/pastoral leadership (the work of the Call Committee). The MSP will be shared with the potential candidates as part of the search process.

The clearer we are about ourselves and the more accurately we can describe ourselves as a congregation (warts and all) the more effective the search process will be. The Call Committee will not be formed until the MSP, Snapshot No. 1 is completed.
