


#### **Exchange Your Old Bibles for New!**

#### **Sunday Adult Forums are Back**

Sunday, September 17, 10:10 AM | Fellowship Hall

This fall our Sunday Adult forums start September 17th at the 10:00 am hour:

**Parables: Hunting for Hidden Truth** – Three Sundays a month we'll engage in a deeper discussion, facilitated by a variety of teachers, around the Parables of Jesus. So often we try to apply an Aesop's fable-type moral to these puzzling stories of Jesus. In reality, they're more like a Buddhist Koan – something to be wrestled with and teased apart until a hidden truth emerges. **Join us on this weekly treasure hunt into the stories you thought you knew!** *Kickoff is on September 17th in the Fellowship Hall.* 

**Experiential Church** – One Sunday a month we're experimenting with a way of getting out of our Lutheran tendency towards heady faith and experiencing it instead through creativity, nature, and embodiment. Each month we'll have a different facilitator bringing new ways of engaging our faith through things like art, nature walks, breath prayers, etc. **This will also have an intergenerational component as well; O-Rock will have a similar focus for the same week, and youth are more than welcome to join the adults.** Starts September 24th, then the 2nd Sunday of the month after that.

#### **LiVE Project Goes Live!**



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

Tanzania – the Soul of Africa. I have this exciting opportunity to attend a trip with my sister, who is a Lutheran pastor in Dakota City, Nebraska, and Lutherans from the Nebraska Synod. I will embark on a two week Vision Trip from January 21 to February 6, 2024. The primary goal of a Vision Trip is to learn about the culture of Tanzania and the ministries of the Northern Diocese. Vision Trips are structured around the ELCA Accompaniment



Model. Accompaniment – which literally means "walking together side by side," is a mutual relationship between companion churches that walk together in service in God's mission.

This is a Vision trip, not a mission trip. We don't go to "do" but to see and learn from our Tanzania leaders of the Northern Diocese that serve as our hosts, showing us the diverse ministries of the Diocese: schools, hospitals, parishes, clinics, orphanages, services for the poor and those disabled, it is primarily about relationships. We go to pray and worship with them, and bring encouragement, support, and love. We will walk in the shoes of our Tanzania brothers and sisters and learn of the hardships and joys that come with that walk.

We will also experience a fabulous safari to the Ngorongoro Crater and the Serengeti National Park. While on this safari we will be seeing the glory of God's creation such as can be experience nowhere else on earth.

As Christians, we are not fully one holy and catholic church without a global perspective. Our companion relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania enlarges our world view. Global connections help us see the world's challenges in a new way and examine our own problems and joys through new eyes. These connections also strengthen God's mission in the world.



I ask for your prayers and support as I see and learn from our Tanzania brothers and sisters and the ELCA Accompaniment model for global missions. Any money donations for this Vision trip would be appreciated.
