#### From the Pastor...

#### Re:Turning to God

As they say, "we will now return to our regularly scheduled programming." On September 21, we close the Summer months, resuming our two-service schedule, ORCA (Our Redeemer's Children's Activities), Sunday Forums, Choir and Band rehearsals, and turn our attention towards the coming seasons.

The turning of flora and foliage of the Fall reorients animals and people to times of feast and fast—of generous banquets and of budgeting for the holidays and the new year. Fall is a transition time, when the seeds of spring are planted, and an interior life grows.

The Christian faith and spirituality can be one of continual turning—reorientation and reformation, continuation and renewal, introspection and outreach. In a word, "return" is an embodiment of the Christian faith—turned towards God and neighbor, no longer fixated by our limitations and inadequacies—to be turned from one way, towards the road home.

In a sense, return is redemption—you may have noticed the change in Newsletter title—to be called anew or named for what we are (God's good creation) is a righteous judgment given by our being reconciled to God in the person of Jesus Christ.

To be returned to God reminds me of *Les Miserables*, when Bishop Myriel buys a new life for Jean Valjean; Jean aims to live one sort of life—the life the national courts have deemed him: a convict. He steals the silver, and, in being returned to the bishop, the stolen silver that makes him a thief is gifted to him, instead. The graceful judgment to redeem him comes from the very person he robbed. And, as Myriel says, "and now I give you back to God."

At this point, he returns to a life without an unjust doom or judgment on his head. Jean Valjean, given a new lease on life, is freed from his debt and reoriented.

With Rousseau's view on society corrupting the will of people, a bit of Pascal's wager. and an evolved Descartes-ian self-determination in the background, Victor Hugo portrays redemption as a turning—and a return to an original state at that—with potential to live anew.

Lutheran views on redemption come through a sense of returning to origin, or source. We, encumbered by sin and burdened by the verdict on our actions under the catchall "sinner" cannot succeed in freeing ourselves and returning to the beginning of our life with God. Instead, God gives a new beginning—a reorientation and a reconciliation in unity with God and all creation.

Our redemption is a return to view of ourselves, as God sees and deems us: capable of the good that God intends for the world, which we could not within our limitations. As Paul's descriptions focus on courtroom imagery, Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church claims that the pronouncement of this "good" news reorients us to live not distinct from creation, but in full communion with it.

In these ways, we return this fall:

- We resume and continue our life together in Christian faith,
- We are reoriented towards community and what the Holy Spirit is doing among us, and
- We are transformed and renewed in the ways that this community is best equipped and called as part of God's world.




# "The Journey" Starts September 28 by Pastor Thomas

The Journey is a series of discussions and conversations (with a potluck meal!) geared toward building relationships, facilitating connections to ministry, and sharing our stories of faith and the life of Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church.

Part of the program affirms the values and perspectives of our Lutheran community, grounding further conversation about Our Redeemer's current pursuit of valued-living. #### Ministry Spotlight: Welcome and Hospitality

We've all been there: attending a party or event when we do not know anyone. Or being alone in a new place or neighborhood—not sure where we will land or who we can rely on. Even for the extroverts among us, the story is the same: without making a connection or being introduced, without having a sense of where we fit or how to navigate the landscape, we'll likely have trouble mustering the courage to put ourselves out there again if we don't feel connected. Isolation can deepen.

Some of us had "those friends" that would find us by the buffet table or on the patio and introduce us—they seemed to know everyone—or, at very least, they were less–familiar with the surroundings, too, and helped us feel less alone. We stayed a little longer before going home from the party, we felt more familiarized with the neighborhood, or we realized that we could take the chance and meet more people and expand our network. **Those small connections can mean the world when we are stepping into an unfamiliar place.** 

Welcome is an experience, not only an invitation. For this reason, welcome has taken on the spirit of hospitality, and in fact, the measure of one's welcome is determined by the measure of hospitality, or so the belief has been over time.

Of course, we cannot always provide the welcome that we find in the Gospels: killing the fatted calf for the prodigal son, providing lamps and robes for banqueters, giving pride of place to every guest, for example. Still, a simpler way of building a community is no less important; how we make room and provide for new faces as well as returning visitors and regulars is crucial to the ministry of care we have been given.

You can probably remember people or inviting language that drew us to certain communities. And church on a Sunday—talk about big events. Even if a person wants some anonymity, remembering the respect they received can be the welcome they need. The best we can do is to put ourselves in those places, and be good neighbors—welcome to a new community is welcome to a new neighborhood. And we know as Christians how expansive that neighborhood can be.

Pastor Thomas and leaders are seeking to rebuild the Welcome Team in this way—we need people who can be good neighbors for long-time residents and newly arrived on the block.
