

From the Pastor...

Taking Church for Granted

Time is a fickle thing; or at least, our sense of time is paradoxical. At once it seems like there is not enough of it—minutes, days, years pass by without notice—and yet, it can seem like the things remain at a standstill. Our sense of time can be marked by the hurriedness of daily living; cooking and cleaning, hygiene and studying, work. "Is there time for the oil change we needed last month?" But time can also go by slowly; "when will that door be fixed?" "When will I fully grow into the person I hope to be?" "When will all this be changed?" The good news is that transformation comes with time and is all the time growing.

However, our sense of time has become the meter by which we measure our lives, time really isn't the issue. There is always plenty of time to live. There is not always plenty of energy to devote to living. "You can do anything, but you cannot do everything" offers a modicum of grounding. Prioritization is a matter of weighing the importance of tasks. But even the most basic of needs—eating, hydrating, sleeping—though these are all important, how we prioritize these lies in our value of these things amid the cares of our life.

So too, is spiritual wellness. Sunday morning can sometimes give pause, but it can often feel hurried; "how long will I stay at church?"—whether service only, or fellowship, too, and factoring in community process and intentional, transformative experiences are all factors that insist to me how I use my time. But **if we begin to think there is ever enough time we can devote to spiritual wellness, there is never enough.** And there will never be enough if we see it not as the grounds from which our health and life grows, but simply a part of a schedule.

We live in a time when choosing church is really that: "Do I attend (or do I attend today)?" "Do I participate (or do I participate this time)?" "How much of my mind, body, and life-giving spirit can I afford to give in relation to the needs of the community of which I am a part?" The choice becomes a question not only of my needs, but the needs for growth and sustaining the congregation. Our choice to be present, to be engaged, or to simply receive sometimes is a choice weighed with our sense of self and our sense of time. It means choosing church is not a light choice, but one of intrinsic value. But therein is the gift; unlike how we factor in time to cook, time to clean, time to converse, time to rest, time to sleep, time spiritual wellness is not really a choice in faith. Faith is a matter of values, and yet, it is not one we measure in the scheme of time, but the ways which faith is cared for, and with our sense of abundance.

Abundance can often allow us to take things as granted. And, in a world that wants for time and energy even at the cost of our wellbeing, we can thank God that the Spirit is always there—it is granted by God for us. Within it is abundance of life. Value in faith can be taken for granted when belonging

to a church. "Oh, I can afford to miss that this time," is a gift to notice the ways the Spirit calls to us out of the impacts on our bodies and needs. And yet, it seems like life in the Spirit is something we can never get enough of.

It is within this tension that value becomes the meter by which we measure our lives. No matter how much I feel activity as a congregation is important - life as a congregation can become part of weighing our priorities. **The good news** is that no matter how much time we spend with faith, the Spirit not only has more than enough to share, but it is nonetheless shared when we choose to prioritize it, in whatever ways we can.

But there is a caveat: we do not know when the Spirit will offer us the gifts we need if we do not pay attention to where it is drawing us. Yet, the Spirit intercedes for us regardless of our timing or making time to receive or attend to it. Nevertheless, **choosing church allows us greater opportunities to see and hear—we increase our chances to participate in what God is doing.** Taking that for granted looks different than taking other relationships or needs for granted; believing God is at work in and in-between us means stepping out in faith, believing that the power of God is not just present, waiting for us to make the move, but that it is active.

In June, we hired Lake Niell as our Volunteer Coordinator. Lake is adept at the tasks and prioritizes his time wisely. And what Lake is hired to do, like me, like Kenna, is give us more opportunities to engage with the God we trust is working through us, within our congregation, on Sundays and in our daily life together.

Some of these things can be as simple as a conversation about life at church; they can be as complex as questions about our current activities and how we are living together in those ways or complicated and difficult discussions that concern our wellbeing and growth as people. Opportunities to notice the Spirit among us, and times to navigate the choices we make as a church that cohere our activities with our values and our energies.

As we move into a renewed time, marked by the end of Summer and the beginning of Fall, marked by further time to be transformed, I encourage us to each day, each week—more times than not—take time to discern the ways our faith makes time and forms not only our values, but how we take advantage of the opportunities to experience the life of the Spirit for which life in Christ's church takes advantage of what we believe: the abundance of time.



New Altar Task Force - An Update by Marie Nordquist, Altar Task Force

The Altar Task Force has been meeting on a regular basis. We've taken our time to get to know one another better, and explore our wants, needs and desires for a new altar. We've considered what we want to say to our congregation and to visitors about our faith, our worship practices, how do we welcome everyone to our table. What is the altar: Humble table? Imposing edifice? Something in between? We've spent lots of meeting time discussing size and dimension, what design elements speak to us. We've considered how the new altar will occupy the chancel space and harmonize with our interior architecture. And, how will we honor tradition while creating something new. It turns out that planning for new liturgical furniture is not like choosing a new living room!

But, we're making progress. At our May meeting, we experimented with various table top shapes and dimensions, as well as height. Thanks go to Guy Michaelsen for the cardboard mockup that was so helpful in working out our basic vision. We now know what will work best for proportion, shape, and height. At our June meeting we mostly solidified our design ideas and are ready to move toward finding a craftsperson.

This Year's Synod Assembly Report

Every year, shortly after Easter, the Northwest Washington Synod, the governing body of the ELCA in our area of the Country, holds a Synod Assembly. A working Assembly is held every other year. On the years in between, a gathering focused on the various ministries and programs of the Synod is held with the intent of familiarizing congregation members with Synod programs that might be of interest to them. At this year's Synod Assembly whose theme was "Woven into God's Story", Our Redeemer's was represented by Pastor Thomas... and John-Otto Liljenstolpe.



Among the most noteworthy decision at this year's Assembly was the re-election of Shelly Bryan Wee as our Synod's bishop. Pricilla Austin, pastor of Immanual Lutheran Church in Seattle and one of the leaders in our synod on issues of racism, received strong support, enough to make necessary a second run off vote. But in the end a majority of the 345 delegates chose Shelly as our bishop for six more years.

The Synod's budget for the coming year was set at \$1,784,274. The budget for 2025 has been \$1,653,825. For a more detailed look at the Synod Budget, go to: https://bit.ly/413BeEo.

While the Northwest Washington Synod continues to experience a decline in congregational membership, a trend which appears to be slowing yet still occurring throughout U.S. Churches, a number of new and innovative forms of ministry are underway in our Synod such as "dinner church" and "wild" (out-of-doors) church. A number of our congregations have merged with neighboring congregations. LMF (Lay Ministry Formation) has completed its second year of training with 16 individuals involved in two cohorts. Chinese, Korean, and Spanish speaking ministries as well as ministries focused on children, youth ministries, and those who have been unchurched or de-churched are continuing to thrive or are under development.

Of all the Churches in the United States, the ELCA has the greatest number of "full communion" relationships with other denominations. These "shared ministries and ministers" agreements are also reflected in the Northwest Washington Synod where a number of our congregation are operating jointly with congregations belonging to non–Lutheran denominations. Like wise some of our congregations are being pastored by ministers from other denominations. And in our area, there are Lutheran pastor serving non–Lutheran congregations. Furthermore, as has been the case for a good many years, our synod as well as other ELCA synods have relationships with "Companion Lutheran Churches" located abroad. Our Synod's companion Lutheran Church abroad is the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Russia (ELCR). A partially successful attempt to meet with some of the leaders of the ELCR was attempted earlier this year.


Finally, the Synod assembly passed several resolutions and memorials. The two resolutions dealt with Supporting Global Refuge's Camino a Casa Program and affirming the Synod's commitment to the Evangelical Lutheran Church In European Russia. The three memorials were concerned with: (1) an affirmation of transgender, nonbinary, gender expansive, two-spirit, and genderqueer people of God; (2) the authorization of the national Church's participation in national legal actions in support of vulnerable ELCA communities; and finally (3) a call for an end to the occupation of Palestine and recognition of its statehood in the United Nations. These resolutions and memorials were passed by the Assembly with little or no opposition.

I assure you that having done so, you will have gained a wider and deeper appreciation of the mission and life of our Church.


