From the Pastor...



LENT ~ JUST DO IT!

My sister-in-law is – and always has been – physically active. I can't remember being with her on any day when she didn't run, teach a spinning class, do hot yoga, play tennis, or ...well, you get the idea. It's just who she is.

I, on the other hand, have active periods in my life. Sometimes for years at a stretch. And I LOVE it! My mood lifts. I'm healthier. I sleep better. I have more energy. I'm stronger. Our bodies are MADE to move! So, of course we feel great! What's NOT to like?

But then, at some point, illness or busyness or a combination of the two, stalls my exercise routine. Getting to my beloved barre studio becomes daunting. Hard. And it takes a kick in the pants to get going.

Which my sister-in-law has provided on many occasions! With her, there's no decision to make, no conversation about "Should we exercise?" Of COURSE, we will! So, I do. And I'm glad. And I'm back in my exercise groove again.

Like physical exercise, faith practices are not that complicated. Prayer. Acts of love and generosity. Fasting from self-indulgence. These "exercises" lift our mood. Help us sleep better. Give us energy. Make us stronger. Give us peace and wisdom and hope. Bless our relationships and make us healthier. What's not to like?

And YET. When we're not in the groove, these faith actions seem daunting—no matter how much we KNOW they will benefit us. We tell ourselves they're too hard to fit in.

Lent is like the faith version of my sister-in-law. It's a kick in the pants to get us doing what we already KNOW will be SO good for us. We're spiritual beings, made to love God, ourselves and our neighbors. To grow into the wholeness of our humanity, we NEED to stretch our souls toward God and strengthen our spirit's ability to serve and love.

So, this year, for Lent's 40 days, just do it! Let Lent boot you out of bed every morning for quiet prayer. Which helps you remember that each day you want to serve your neighbor. Or make a gift to encourage someone whose hope is running on empty. Let Lent shut down your screens, so you can call your brother to say you're sorry. Let Lent inspire you to pick up a devotional or the Bible every day, to listen for God's voice.

Prayer. Acts of love. Fasting/decreasing focus on yourself. To stretch your soul. To strengthen your spirit's compassion. To learn to rely on God. It's pretty basic.

Lent is here. And Lent says: LET'S DO IT!


This year, Lent begins in the wilderness. Our intentional journey toward new life begins when we within our own personal "state of the wild." As Professor Niedner taught us last year, in Hebrew, the word for wilderness literally means, "a place beyond words. A place without sign posts."

- Jesus begins his ministry in the wilderness when the Spirit drives him to come face to face with temptation.
- The Hebrews begin to trust God in the wilderness where they learn to stop being slaves and become free and faithful people.

This year our daily devotions, Sunday worship, and special Lenten worship will all grow from Biblical stories, nature experiences, and personal memories of wilderness times and gifts.

The wilderness – "the place beyond words, the place without sign posts" – is where we become honest about ourselves, remember Whose we are, and let the Spirit lead us into entirely new territory in life.

This Lent, we let God be our guide as we travel together into wilderness...

Lent Devotional 2020

Starting March 1st, you are invited to venture through the wilderness with our devotional from Sanctified Art. Beginning with Ash Wednesday and ending with Easter Sunday, **this devotional includes art, poetry, prompts, and reflections inspired by the Lenten lectionary scriptures (year A) and the theme,** Wilderness.

"Lent begins in the wilderness. The Spirit quides Jesus into the wilderness where he comes face to face with temptation and struggle. Yet, in his forty days of fasting, resisting, and wandering, Jesus is shaped and formed for ministry. Similarly, through the wilderness of Lent, we are invited to surrender to the wild leadings of the Spirit. We rarely enter the wilderness willingly, but hopefully through our wandering we remember who we are and whose we are. The wilderness can become sacred even if it remains dangerous. There is no wilderness space too harsh or threatening for God's love. This Lent, we welcome you to the journey."

If you would like a paper copy of the booklet, a few will be available at church. To cut down on costs and prevent environmental harm, we'd like to keep printing to a minimum.

Also available are a new resource, **daily devotional cards.**

WHAT IT IS:

48 devotional cards with a word for the day and a scripture verse and short prayer. Print, cut, and select a card each day of Lent beginning with Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday.

HOW TO USE IT:

- Select a card a day (order doesn't matter), contemplate the words for the wilderness, and read the scripture verse and short prayer.
- Get creative and display your words in a fun way—adhere the cards to a fridge or wall, create a fun wall hanging, or arrange them on a desk or table. Display the cards so you can continue journeying with the words throughout the entire season of Lent.
- This is a great daily devotional for middle & high school youth, college students, young adults, and adults of all ages—especially those in search of a short and sweet spiritual practice they can sustain for 48 days.

Faith Formation Team Vitality Survey Results

On Sunday, February 23rd, the Faith Formation team was introduced to the congregation at the 9am and 11am services. Between the services the team presented the results of the recent church vitality survey.

We received a total of 104 responses from a wide cross section of the congregation. The overall score about how well the church is doing in different areas was a 4.5 out of 5 (on a scale of 1–5, 5 being



best). We did have scores of 3s and 2s but these were generally much less in number. The survey returned results that indicate that, in general, **Our Redeemer's is a thriving church community where people feel connected to each other. We believe our pastors care about us and support us in our efforts to build a relationship with God.**

The area with the lowest scores were two questions regarding personal faith: 1) Do we live our faith in our daily life, and 2) Do we feel equipped to share our faith with others. **Supporting these efforts is the purpose behind our work on the Faith Formation Team.**

Based on these results, the team will move forward with a focus on three things:

- 1. Intergenerational Learning and Opportunities
- 2. Connecting faith between home and church; how can we continue to grow our faith beyond Sunday worship?
- 3. Creating a Phone App specific to Our Redeemers which will facilitate our work in a much more accessible way for all.

Adult Forum: The Art of Forgiving

When You Need to Forgive and Don't Know How

Sundays, March 1 through April 5, 10:10-10:50am, Library

During Lent, we return to God to seek wholeness in our lives and faith. Where to start? Often, with our relationships. Sometimes, only bitterness or pain seems possible when we have been wronged, but we don't HAVE to stay stuck in anger and misery

This series will be led by Pastor Kathy, and based on *The Art* of *Forgiving* by Lewis Smedes. Smedes has not just written about forgiveness for decades, he has also worked with people struggling to free their future from the pain of past betrayals. There is no magic here, but you'll receive a wise, practical step-by-step guide to the healing path to peace and freedom.



Topics covered:

- Why we forgive (often the person who benefits most is the forgiver);
- What we do when we forgive (perhaps not what we expect);
- Whom we forgive (only those who directly wrong us);
- How we forgive. Join us!

*Note: This will be a learning, rather than a therapy group. There are no expectations for sharing beyond what each person may wish to. But, as always, Pastor Kathy and Pastor Gretchen are available if you'd like to talk more.

Interfaith Advocacy Days Report

On Thursday, February 6, six Our Redeemers folks joined 200 others made our way to Olympia to participate in Interfaith Advocacy. Faith Action Network sponsors this event and our own Paul Oldenkamp delivered two workshops on Healthcare.

We met Speaker of the House, Lauri Jinkin, shortly after we convened, who had carved time out of her very busy day to be with us. The House was in session while we were there, and her time was precious. We were inspired by Rabbi Goldstein and sat down with our congressional aids to let them know our hopes.

The agenda was long – two pages of bills that support equity, reducing poverty and violence, and homelessness. Workshops were led by Earth Ministry, the Alliance for Gun Responsibility, Washington Immigrant Solidarity Network, Balance Our Tax Code, FAN's Health Care work group, Washington Low Income Housing Alliance, and Co-Director Paul Benz on the topic of Criminal Justice. We ended the day hearing from some key elected officials on how the session is going and how FAN can support the passage of justice-centered bills.

Immigration Follow Up

At our last national assembly, the ELCA declared itself a "Sanctuary denomination". In its simplest form, becoming a sanctuary denomination means that the ELCA made a public statement that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith.

The Social Justice team has been having conversation about immigration for some time. In 2019, we set aside four Sundays to explore immigration in an inter-generational education class. In January/ February of this year, we used three Sundays to explore what is currently going on in the Seattle area around immigration. The Executive Director of the Church Council of Greater Seattle, Michael Ramos gave us the lay of the land for faith-based work in the Seattle area and helped us think about what our role might be in this local and national conversation. Most importantly, Michael encouraged us to choose with intention our ways of being involved. So we are forming a team, or task force (limited in scope and time) to decide how to move forward. The one thing we know: we want to learn more.

Build the Vision: Share the Vision! Monthly Update

With a purchase and sale agreement now signed by both Our Redeemer's and GROW/Ballard P-Patch, our vision-aligned plans to renovate are moving steadily forward!

PRESENTATION OF PLANS AND BUDGET



After late worship on February 16, about 88 people gathered for lunch and a presentation by our architects (SHKS), members of our Vision–Aligned Building Team, Church Council, and our owner's representative.

Renderings (drawings) and floor plans showed where we are in the design for the narthex, offices, meeting rooms, sanctuary, accessible daylight basement entrance, and the landscape plan. David Strauss of SHKS Architects described how the plans have grown from Our Redeemer's mission, values, and roots, while accomplishing the project goals set out at the beginning. He described the improvements and explained that most decisions relating to "soul and character" of the space are still ahead (e.g., colors, lighting design, furniture, etc.). Guy Michaelsen, an Our Redeemer's member and principal at The Berger Partnership Landscape Architects, described the overall themes that will tie the renovations together. He also introduced the landscape plans.

The presentation also included a virtual reality (VR) head-set. Put it on, and you could navigate through the spaces where you wanted. A video offered a similar experience.

Terrence Rindler (Council Member), Mike Hlastala (Council and VAB Member), and Brandy Fox (Owner's Rep) described in some detail what has gone into the \$3.7 million budget – both the contractor's estimated pricing, the soft (or project) costs (such as fees, licenses, experts, furnishings, etc.), when and fairly generous contingency percentages to ensure unforeseen expenses (fairly common when renovating an older building) can be addressed. A list of in terms of meeting the budget, monies in hand, plus anticipated income from sale of the property will require a loan of about \$700,000. Council has already spoken to Thrivent Financial and Mission Investment Fund (an arm of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America), both of which have a long history of construction loans to churches. Another option being explored is inviting members to make a "mission" loan to the church, administered by a non-profit company.

Assuming the sale with GROW/Ballard P-Patch is on track to close, we expect to have a congregational vote on the budget in late May – early June.
